UNIFORM POLICY – YEARS 3 TO 6

All items listed below are available from the College Uniform Suppliers, as detailed on the Uniform List.

The Headmaster of the Junior School will make the final decision on all issues relating to school uniform.

College Blazer	
House Tie. When wearing a tie: the top button of the shirt must be fastened; the tie knot placed at the collar of the shirt, the tie knot must of sensible size, the tie must be worn at a sensible length (i.e. to reach just above the waistband of the trousers or skirt).	
Plain, white, collared shirt (long or short sleeved). Shirts must be tucked into trousers/skirts at all times.	
Plain, black polished leather (or 'leather look') shoes.	
The following footwear is not acceptable: trainers, shoes with open toe design, high heels or sling backs.	
Long-sleeved, 'v' neck, dark blue, College pullover or cardigan.	
Plain navy outdoor coat.	
BOYS	GIRLS
Plain, dark grey, tailored trousers or shorts	Dark grey skirt
Plain, black or grey socks	Plain, navy knee-high socks or tights
SUMMER UNIFORM	
As Winter Uniform	College Summer Dress This is an optional item for girls in years 3 to 6, and can be worn either with navy tights, or with white ankle socks
If a T-shirt is to be worn under a shirt, this must be nothing else other than plain and white. Sweatshirts of any description do not qualify as a coat or a sweater and so are not permitted to be worn. School uniform must be kept clean, tidy and in good repair at all times Pupils should arrive at and depart from school dressed according to the terms of this policy.	
JEWELLERY	
BOYS	GIRLS
No jewellery is to be worn, other than a watch	Those with pierced ears may wear two, plain gold/silver studs or small sleepers - one in each earlobe. No other jewellery is permitted, other than a watch.
HAIR	
Pupils' hair must be clean, tidy, off the face and of reasonable length and style. Extreme bleaches, highlights or dyes that are in blatant contrast to the hair's natural colour are not permitted. It is also not acceptable to have styles where lines and/or shapes are cut into the hair. Hair gel is not permitted.	
BOYS	GIRLS
'Number 2' or shorter haircuts are not permitted. Hair must not be on or below the collar; the fringe must be above the eye line so as not to obscure vision.	Hair must not fall across the face. Hair that is less than shoulder length must be secured by ties that are substantial enough. Hair of shoulder length or longer must be tied back in a ponytail or plaited. Hair bands, ribbons and slides should be in sober, dark colours. Hair extensions are not permitted.
MAKE-UP	
No make-up is to be worn. The only exception to this rule is if permission has been granted on medical grounds.	
SCHOOL BAGS	
All pupils should purchase the regulation school bag (a rucksack or laptop style). PE holdalls/bags can be of individual choice, but should be in sober, dark colours with a minimum of decoration.	

UNIFORM POLICY – RECEPTION TO YEAR 2

All items listed below are available from the College Uniform Suppliers, as detailed on the Uniform List.

House Tie - elasticated	
Plain, white, collared shirt (long or short sleeved). Shirts must be tucked into trousers/skirts at all times.	
Plain, black polished leather (or 'leather look') shoes	
The following footwear is not acceptable: trainers, shoes with open toe design, high heels or sling backs.	
Long-sleeved, 'v' neck, dark blue, College pullover or cardigan	
Plain navy outdoor coat	
BOYS	GIRLS
Plain, dark grey, tailored trousers or shorts	Dark grey pinafore/tunic
Plain, black or grey socks	Plain, navy knee-high socks or tights
SUMMER UNIFORM	
As Winter Uniform	College Summer Dress This can be worn either with navy tights, or with white ankle socks
<p>If a T-shirt is to be worn under a shirt, this must be nothing else other than plain and white. JEWELLERY	
BOYS	GIRLS
No jewellery is to be worn, other than a watch	Those with pierced ears may wear two, plain gold/silver studs or small sleepers - one in each earlobe. No other jewellery is permitted, other than a watch.

HAIR	
<p>Pupils' hair must be clean, tidy, off the face and of reasonable length and style. Extreme bleaches, highlights or dyes that are in blatant contrast to the hair's natural colour are not permitted. It is also not acceptable to have styles where lines and/or shapes are cut into the hair. Hair gel is not permitted.</p>	
BOYS	GIRLS
'Number 2' or shorter haircuts are not permitted. Hair must not be on or below the collar; the fringe must be above the eye line so as not to obscure vision.	Hair must not fall across the face. Hair that is less than shoulder length must be secured by ties that are substantial enough. Hair of shoulder length or longer must be tied back in a ponytail or plaited. Hair bands, ribbons and slides should be in sober, dark colours. Hair extensions are not permitted.

MAKE-UP
No make-up is to be worn. The only exception to this rule is if permission has been granted on medical grounds.

SCHOOL BAGS
All pupils should purchase the regulation school book bag. PE holdalls/bags can be of individual choice, but should be in sober, dark colours with a minimum of decoration.
