SPORT SCHOLARSHIPS (Year 7 to Year 11)

Sport scholarships are awarded to Scarborough College pupils purely on merit and are not means tested.

The award is made on the basis of a pupil's accomplishment in, and commitment to, sport. As an indication of expected levels of achievement, pupils might be expected to have gained county or regional representative honours in at least one of the College's major sports, whilst demonstrating proficiency in others.

The scholarship is an award made on the basis of assessed merit at the discretion of the College, and the College's decision is final. Applicants may be expected to undergo a sports assessment. In addition, candidates will be expected to provide a brief portfolio to demonstrate their sporting interests and achievements to-date and will undergo an interview with the Headmaster. References from clubs and societies may also be included.

To qualify for a scholarship of any sort, College pupils are expected to be able to demonstrate a very positive behavioural record and to be recognised by staff as having many of the attributes necessary to succeed in their studies, in particular in connection with the IB Learner Profile (www.ibo.org/globalassets/digital-toolkit/flyers-and-artworks/learner-profile-en.pdf), and the College reserves the right to remove the award where there are significant concerns about a student's progress or commitment over time, or who otherwise acts inappropriately.

The title of Sport Scholar remains throughout Years 7 to 11, as does the connected financial award.

The College also reserves the right to award an Honorary Sport Scholarship to students whose parents already hold a separate scholarship or substantial bursary, and to the children of staff members. Honorary Scholarships do not carry a fees remission.

Expectations of a Sport Scholar

It is vital that the scholarship process should encourage and reward attitudes to College life that will set standards for, and inspire, others. It is a given that scholars are expected to dedicate themselves to the College's extra-curricular programme throughout each academic year, whilst achieving well in the realm of academia.

Scholars are role models in the College and are expected to take the lead in all aspects of the extra-curricular activities of the College and the Houses. They are also strongly encouraged to be fully involved in the likes of mentoring and in providing coaching and support for the years below them as they move up through the school.

They are encouraged to make the very most of their talents and to explore the opportunities to gain success and recognition in the wider world, with the support of the College.

Financial Award

Holders of the scholarship will receive up to a 20% discount on day tuition fees (i.e. boarding fees are not discounted) across all three terms in each year from Year 7 to Year 11 inclusive.
