Dear Years 10 and Lower Sixth Parents / Guardians

With two more year groups due to return to school on 15 June, there has been a great deal of demand for more information from the Government on what is expected from schools and what safety measures need to be taken. Parents, teachers and pupils need to have information so they can make decisions about what to do with regards to pupils coming back to school.

I thought the Education Secretary's comments, shown below, would be a useful start to my email regarding the return of some of our senior school pupils next week.

"We continue to follow the best scientific advice and believe that this cautious, phased return is the most sensible course of action to take. I know students who are due to take exams in 2021 will have experienced considerable disruption to their education this year and we are committed to doing all we can to minimise the effects of this. Exams will take place next year and we are working with Ofqual and the exam boards on our approach to these. While these are the first steps, they are the best way to ensure all children can get back into the classroom as soon as possible."

I hope the following information, therefore provides the necessary answers to any questions you may have regarding your child's return to school next week.

Please note that school transport will not be running and so it will be necessary for each pupil to organise their own means of transport. If any pupil is intending on using public transport to get to school, please will you let me know.

Pupils and staff are permitted to wear face masks and gloves if they wish. There is no school policy explicitly stating that they must or, conversely, cannot wear protective equipment. The College has received no Government directive on the matter and so we will leave it to each individual pupil to choose what they feel is appropriate. Regular hand sanitisation, social distancing and appropriate supervision and direction of these will be in place.

To help with this decision making process, please see the outline of what a typical day might look like:

- 8:30 a.m. Pupils arrive at school. Each pupil's 'group' is the only group in school on any given day. Each pupil will have a packed lunch, snacks, chrome book, pencil case and a coat. Pupils should wear appropriate 'casual clothes' so the outer layer can be washed each day.



- 8:35 a.m. Pupils will be directed to their designated classroom(s). The classrooms look very different. All unnecessary items have been removed, each classroom has been deep cleaned and the desks have been spaced out by two metres. There are two classrooms specifically set up for my group's lessons during the day. There are no more than fifteen pupils in a group.
  
- 8:35 - 9.00 a.m. Registration and tutor time
- 9:00 - 9:55 a.m. Period 1 - my group is split into two teaching classes
- 10:00 - 10:55 a.m. Period 2 - my group is split into two teaching classes
- 10:55 - 11:15 a.m. Supervised break outside or inside with social distance rules applying
- 11:15 a.m. - 12:10 p.m. Period 3 - my group is split into two teaching classes
- 12:15 - 1:10 p.m. Period 4 - my group is split into two teaching classes
- 1:10 - 2:00 p.m. Supervised lunch outside or inside with social distance rules applying
- 2:00 - 2:55 p.m. Period 5 - my group is split into two teaching classes
- 3:00 - 3:55 p.m. Period 6 - my group is split into two teaching classes
- 4:00 p.m. Pick up time and all areas are cleaned as per Government guidelines in preparation for the classrooms being used in two days' time.

The timetable and organisation of Year 12 (Group 1) and Year 10 (Groups 2 and 3) are shown below.

On a personal note, I am looking forward to seeing the pupils next week. It will be a different experience but by following Government guidelines, using common sense and putting social distancing at the centre of all we do, we will minimize the risk to children, staff and parents.

As Mr Emmett mentioned in his email on Friday, there is absolutely no pressure for your child to attend, it must be a decision that is right for your whole family. Similarly, if it suits you for your child to attend one day or not another day, please let me know so that teachers are aware of who they can expect to see in school.
